■ Steps Before an Emergency

- Create a family emergency contact list.
- Agree on two meeting points (local & out-of-town).
- Share your plan with all family members.

■ During an Emergency

- Use text messages instead of calls to reduce network load.
- Call your out-of-town contact to relay information.
- Keep a charged power bank.

■ After an Emergency

- Check in with your emergency contacts.
- Update your status on social media safety check tools (e.g., Facebook Safety Check).
- Contact local authorities for instructions.
