## **Hurricane Evacuation & Safety — Checklist**

A compact, printable list for families and crews

Always follow local authorities' instructions.

1) Pre-Season & Now
$\square$ Know your evacuation zone and local shelters.
$\square$ Choose 2 destinations (nearby $\&$ out of region); confirm with hosts.
$\square$ Save emergency numbers; print a paper contact list.
☐ Photograph/scan IDs, insurance, deeds, medical records; back up to cloud + USB☐ Check home insurance (wind/flood coverage, deductibles).
☐ Service roof, gutters, trees, sump pump; buy shutters or pre-cut plywood.
☐ Test smoke/CO detectors; stock fire extinguisher.
☐ Prep generator (outdoor use only); extension cords rated for load.
2) 7-Day Supplies (per person)  ☐ Water: 1 gal / 3.8 L per day × 7 (plus pets).
☐ Water: I gar / 5.6 E per day × / (pids pets). ☐ Shelf-stable food × 7 days; manual can opener.
☐ Meds for 14–30 days; copies of prescriptions.
☐ First-aid kit; masks, gloves, hand sanitizer.
☐ Hygiene items; baby & pet supplies.
☐ Power: power banks, spare phone cables, batteries, NOAA/AM-FM radio.
☐ Lighting (LED lamps/flashlights), no candles.
☐ Cash in small bills.
<b>3) Go-Bag (per person)</b> □ IDs, insurance, USB with documents, contact list.
☐ 3 days of clothes, sturdy shoes, rain gear.
☐ Personal meds + basic first aid.
☐ Snacks & water, whistle, multitool, small flashlight.
☐ Chargers, power bank, radio.
☐ Comfort items for kids; pet leash/carrier, vet papers.
<b>4) Vehicle Ready</b> □ Full tank (or 80%+), spare fuel where legal/safe.
☐ Tires, fluids, wipers OK; paper map of routes.
☐ Car go-bag: water, snacks, first aid, blankets.
5) Home Hardening (before arrival)  ☐ Install shutters/plywood; brace garage door.
☐ Bring in/anchor outdoor items (furniture, grills, tanks).
☐ Clear gutters/drains; place sandbags if flood-prone.
☐ Move electronics/valuables off the floor & away from windows.
☐ Set fridge/freezer to coldest; freeze water bottles/ice packs.
☐ Unplug non-essentials; shut off gas/propane only if authorities advise.
☐ Fill bathtubs/containers for sanitation (if water outages likely).

b) Evacuate — Triggers
☐ Official evacuation order or surge-zone notice.
$\square$ You live in a mobile home/low-lying or flood-prone area.
☐ Medically dependent on electricity/oxygen.
$\square$ You cannot secure home safely or are outside help zones.
$\hfill\square$ Leave 24–36 h before landfall if possible; follow lane reversals and approved routes.
7) If You Must Shelter at Home
☐ Choose an interior, windowless safe room; helmets/mattresses inside.
☐ Keep radio on; phones charged; conserve power.
$\square$ Stay inside during the eye—the back side can be worse.
$\square$ Generator outdoors only, 6+ m from doors/windows; never in garage.
$\square$ Avoid floodwaters; do not wade/drive through.
8) After the Hurricane
Treat all downed lines as live; report hazards.
☐ Use bottled/boiled water until declared safe.
☐ Wear gloves/boots/respirator; watch for mold & sharp debris.
☐ Document damage (photos/video) before cleanup; start claims early.
$\square$ Ventilate before running generators/cleaning agents indoors.
$\square$ Check on neighbors, especially elderly/disabled; share supplies & info.
